He is 11 years old and he loves soccer, basketball and lacrosse. Your story really resonated with us, as it showed that even a good student athlete can become addicted to drugs. Ben has not yet been exposed to drugs (with the exception of alcohol via my husband and me, and other adults in his life), and we are so very fortunate to have resources such as yourselves to educate him in advance of being in close proximity to drugs. Funny, on the way home I asked Ben if he would be interested in going to see Chris Herren, former Boston Celtics player, speak. He surprised me and said no. He said he did not need to hear again about the effects of drugs - he said based on what he has learned in Health class and what he learned last night, he understands and he does not want to do them. To be honest, I would much rather have him hear a story about someone who did not get a second chance versus someone who has gotten one.
